I would **not** expect DTC-60's to improve rear lockup versus Hawk Blues, as they are at least as aggressive. Many local guys have had luck with the HP+ compound in the rear to reduce rear lockup.

DTC-60s may work in the rear, with DTC-70s in the front, but not in combination with the Blues.
